PROCULTHER-NET Ex-ante Feasibility Study

PROCULTHER-NET - *Protecting Cultural Heritage from the Consequences of Disasters-Network* project, co-funded under a European Union Civil Protection Mechanism (UCPM) initiative by the Directorate-General for European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (DG-ECHO), is **the natural continuation of the PROCULTHER project**, developed between 2019 and 2021 with the aim of defining European technical and operational capacities for the protection of Cultural Heritage at risk of disaster. PROCULTHER-NET, eager to consolidate the results achieved through PROCULTHER, aims at ensuring a sustainable and comprehensive network-based exchange on issues that can increase the efficiency and effectiveness of civil protection and disaster risk management actions, as well as to inform decision makers and advocate for the inclusion of Cultural Heritage in disaster risk management processes.

The PROCULTHER-NET project is implemented by the Italian Civil Protection Department (Italy) in collaboration with the International Centre for the Study of Preservation and Restoration of Cultural Property (ICCROM), the Ministry of Interior-Disaster and Emergency Management Authority - AFAD (Turkey), the German Archeological Institute - DAI (Germany), the Ministére de l'Intérieur - Direction Générale de la Sécurité Civile et de la Gestion des Crises (France), the Fondazione Hallgarten - Franchetti Centro Studi Villa Montesca, the Ministry of Culture and Tourism of the Region Government of Castilla y León (Spain), the Federal Agency for Technical Relief - THW, the Suor Orsola Benincasa University - UNISOB (Italy), and the University of Porto - UPORTO (Portugal).

Despite its fundamental importance for the resilience and development of our society, Cultural Heritage protection is still considered a non-traditional civil protection sector, and many efforts should still be made to strengthen the link among Civil Protection Authorities, cultural affairs actors and knowledge holders, to define a shared science-based *modus operandi* on the effective inclusion of Cultural Heritage in Disaster Risk Management (DRM) processes.

Building on the positive results of the previous project, PROCULTHER-NET pursues two main objectives:

1 . To establish a European thematic community, within the Union Civil Protection Knowledge Network (KN), focused on the protection and preservation of Cultural Heritage at risk of disaster, gathering and involving the largest number of actors and stakeholders active in the field (e.g., public authorities, non-governmental organizations, volunteer corps, etc.), through a multidisciplinary approach to enhance cooperation and to support and complement the effort made at European level.

2 . To increase UCPM interoperability standards by reinforcing know-how transfer and learning processes on the inclusion of Cultural Heritage protection in DRM processes within the Union Civil Protection Knowledge Network.

The Union Civil Protection Knowledge Network

Among the actions implemented by the European Union in support of fostering collaboration and coordination on prevention and preparedness among Member States are several initiatives ranging from skill development to participatory activities, such as the UCPM Training Programme, the Exchange of Civil Protection Experts' programme and Civil Protection Exercises.

One of the most important provisions of Decision No 1313/2013/EU, as amended by Decision (EU) 2019/420 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 13 March 2019, concerns the role of the Union Civil Protection Knowledge Network, which has been strengthened in order to consolidate cooperation and participation between the Member States participating in the UCPM. This tool aims to collect and bring together the various stakeholders, institutions and actors involved in disaster risk management.

The Knowledge Network's main objectives are to:

- Bridge across knowledge holders relevant to the UCPM;

- Enhance coordination, cooperation, compatibility and complementarity between capacities and improve the competence of experts;

- Collect and share knowledge, experience, expertise, skills, competence, lessons learnt, and best practices in close cooperation with civil protection authorities and disaster management authorities and knowledge centres;

- Stimulate research and innovation and encourage the introduction and use of relevant new technologies;

- Strengthen the links between civil protection and disaster management actors and develop a shared

understanding and a common culture of prevention, preparedness and response.

Ex-Ante Feasibility Study

In order to facilitate the identification of the contents and processes on which to build the experience of a Cultural Heritage protection community within the Knowledge Network, the PROCULTHER-NET project will develop an ex-ante feasibility study aimed at providing an overview of the state-of-the-art regarding DRM methodologies in use at local, European and international level to ensure the protection and preservation of both tangible (movable/immovable) and intangible Cultural Heritage assets. Therefore, this has been conceived to identify the emerging priorities in terms of contents, methods, and target of the action, as well as on the structural modalities needed to sustainably link the thematic community to the objectives of the KN.

In particular, the feasibility study aims to collect information on 3 fundamental fields, namely:

- 1. Interests and needs existing at European Level to ensure the inclusion of the protection of Cultural Heritage at risk of disaster in DRM.
- 2. Capacities, as well as best practices and lessons learnt existing at European Level to ensure the inclusion of the protection of Cultural Heritage at risk of disaster in DRM.
- 3. Mapping stakeholders relevant for the objectives of the project, including civil protection and Cultural Heritage Authorities, academia/scientific centers, international and humanitarian organizations.

Methodology

The information will be collected through a questionnaire, which will be circulated to the different contact points of the Member States and Participating States within the UCPM, as well as to other relevant actors active in the field of Cultural Heritage.

The questions will address specific topics taking into consideration tools, methods, procedures related to the following elements:

- 1. Prevention, meaning activities and measures to avoid existing and new disaster risks,
- 2. **Preparedness**, meaning the knowledge and capacities developed by governments, response and recovery organizations, communities and individuals to effectively anticipate, respond to and recover from the impacts of likely, imminent or ongoing disasters,
- 3. **Response**, meaning actions taken directly prior to, during or immediately after a disaster in order to save lives, reduce health impacts, ensure public safety and meet the basic subsistence needs of the people affected,
- 4. EU Civil Protection Knowledge Network and Thematic Community.

The target audience of the questionnaire is wide and **will possibly require the involvement of subjects from different domains:** not only Civil Protection/DRM authorities and Cultural Heritage representatives at different territorial level but also actors from Academia and International Organizations.

The estimated length of the questionnaire is about 20 minutes. Although almost all questions are mandatory (asterisks are used to mark required fields), the questionnaire is composed almost entirely from closed-ended questions and the logic of the questions is repeated among the different sections.

The results of the study will serve to establish the foundations of the Cultural Heritage protection community within the KN. For this reason, UCPM Member and Participating States are requested to participate in the questionnaire, ensuring at least the involvement of the main cultural affairs actor (e.g., Ministry of Culture/Cultural Affairs) to guarantee that the national technical inputs and interests - both in the field of DRM and Cultural Heritage protection - are reflected and represented within the KN. Therefore, it is preferable that only one questionnaire per country is provided.

Nevertheless, the widest involvement/identification of stakeholders is, however, expected through two modalities:

1. A single questionnaire per country, based on the coordination between all the relevant actors at national level.

2. Spontaneous completion of the questionnaire (expression of interest) from various actors (universities, regions, municipalities, NGOs, etc.) willing to share case studies at European level and interested in participating in the KN.

The questionnaire will maintain a particular focus on practices fostering the resilience of communities as an essential premise to anticipate the effects of climate-change related hazards (e.g., floods and forest fires) and geological hazards (e.g., seismic hazard), as well as those adopting a multi-risk/systemic risk approach. Special emphasis is dedicated to cross-sectoral cooperation and interoperability issues and practices, in particular those addressing a link between the action of Civil Protection/DRM authority and Cultural Heritage actors that demonstrate interoperability and quality advancements resulting from the inclusion of the protection of Cultural Heritage in DRM. Furthermore, all the participants are strongly encouraged to provide any comment or suggestion on criteria and elements that can serve to build a sustainable and effective Cultural Heritage protection focused Thematic Community within the KN.

All collected data will be used informally, for the sole purpose of contextual analysis and to guide future project activities in a functional and optimal manner and will not be binding in any way.

We strictly preserve the privacy of participants and all data will be collected and analysed following procedures aimed at guaranteeing the compliance with the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation) and the national privacy legislations.
